

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"And he led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God." (Luke 24:50-53, ESV)

When I attended seminary down in St. Louis, every student was assigned to a "fieldwork congregation." It was a local church where seminary students would get their first exposure to church work: leading the liturgy, going with the pastor on visits, eventually preaching sermons themselves. My church was Trinity Lutheran Church in rural St. Charles. It was a beautiful church and I have many great memories of that farming community. One tradition I remember fondly was their annual Ascension Day service. Ascension Day always falls on a Thursday (forty days after Easter) and it would be an evening service with a dinner beforehand to celebrate the seminary students who helped out. They would always gift us with a nice book and a seminarian always preached the service. (I got to do it twice!)

In every church I've served as a pastor since seminary, I've made it a point to offer an Ascension Day service. (Ours this year is May 9th at 7:00 P.M.!) Part of it is nostalgia of those services in seminary, but mostly it's fascination with the celebration of Jesus leaving His disciples and returning to His Father. Jesus leaving this earth would seem like an occasion of sadness. But St. Luke tells us differently. Upon leaving them, he writes "And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God." (Luke 24:53)

The Ascension of Jesus is indeed a day of great joy! It is, along with Pentecost ten days later, effectively the birth of the Church. It is also a wonderful and joyful thing that our Lord has gone to His Father's right hand. The One who suffered, died, and rose for us is with the Father. The Scriptures refer to Jesus before God as our "Advocate." He is there on our behalf. We need never doubt that our prayers are heard. We need never doubt that God is for us.

When candidates run for public office, they always say that they'll be there "for their constituents." However, they end up in Washington...or Lansing...or Madison and end up voting for wars and spending and policies that no one actually wants. Many of us feel frustrated that we're not represented in the places of power.

There's no place of greater power than the throne of God. And you are more than "represented." The One who reigns at His Father's right hand is one with you. He's shared in our struggles. He is the One who truly "advocates" for the children of God. That gives us as the Church abundant reason to rejoice!

Life Newsbytes

France Becomes First Country in the World to Make Killing Babies in Abortions a Constitutional Right - France made history by becoming the first country to embed a fictitious "right" to abortion in its constitution. Lawmakers from both chambers of parliament convened on March 4 and easily passed this horrific amendment. The bill in this liberal nation garnered an overwhelming 780-72 vote in favor, prompting nearly the entire joint session to rise for a prolonged standing ovation. Leading pro-life campaigners were saddened to see politicians clapping for killing babies. French President Emmanuel Macron pledged safeguard abortion against any potential future attempts to protect women and their babies ... Earlier this year, during the annual March for Life in Paris, about 20,000 people urged lawmakers to reject the pro-abortion change. Nicolas Bauer, associate researcher at the European Centre for Law and Justice, said the proposed amendment is a radical move by pro-abortion leftists. "By inserting it into the constitution, the left wants to make abortion sacred as if it were a value at the heart of the national 'social contract," Bauer told the Catholic News Agency last year. "From being a crime, abortion has become a banal medical act, and the left now is seeking to make it a fundamental right, superior to every other right." (LifeNews.com, 3/4/24)

STEWARDSHIPMore Than a Negative

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given.

You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.


